



Crime Stoppers of Natchitoches: Empowering the Community with "See Something, Say Something

In historic Natchitoches, Louisiana, community safety relies on resident vigilance. Crime Stoppers of Natchitoches empowers locals through anonymous tips and the "See Something, Say Something" approach.

Launched in 2021 as a non-profit, Crime Stoppers partners with law enforcement and the community to solve crimes anonymously. Funded initially by the city and donations, it encourages information sharing to keep homes, families, and businesses safe.

Tipsters remain fully anonymous—no personal info required, just a code for reward claims.

- •Submit Tips: Call (318) 238-2388, use the P3 Tips app, or visit p3tips.com.
- •Rewards: Up to \$3,000 cash for tips leading to arrests in serious crimes (e.g., homicides, weapons, drugs).
- Community Impact
- •Since launch, anonymous tips have aided arrests in kidnappings, shootings, and more. In 2025, Natchitoches reported overall crime reductions, thanks to task forces, technology, and public cooperation—including Crime Stoppers tips.










Notary Public Exam Prep Course to begin Jan. 27

NATCHITOCHES - Northwestern State University's Office of Electronic Learning and Global Education will offer a Notary Public Exam Prep Course starting Tuesday, Jan. 27. The early bird fee is \$499 until Jan. 7 and \$519 after that date.

In partnership with Louisiana State University-Shreveport, this 52-hour course is an introduction to notary public fundamentals. The instructor, attorney, and notary, Jennifer Brown, will distribute significant course study guides and materials to assist in preparation for the exam. This course will be delivered via online video conferencing.



Participants must have broadband access, a camera, and sound. The test is based on the Louisiana Secretary of State's newest edition of "The Fundamentals of Louisiana Notarial Law and Practice," only available at www.sos.la.gov. For more information, call (225) 922-0507. Participants must have this book before the end of the course. Those in the class will also need the "Louisiana Notary Exam Sidepiece" to the 2026 Study Guide by Steven Alan Childress, which will be available on Amazon in early February 2026.

Near-Death Experiences

Have you ever seen your life literally flash before your eyes? Have you ever been so close to a situation like this, where you observed tragic incidents that occurred that you knew could have been you? Had the Lord decided not to hold back death and allowed your time to roll on a little while longer? What about the sickness that was assigned to take you out? What about times when you were planning to be at a certain place, and you didn't go, but later that night or early the next morning, you received the news that that place, and all the people who were there lives tragically taken? These are actually "Near Death Experiences. "My daughter Jade, who is 30, was ten back then in 06/11/2006 as we brought my nephew Kevin (18) and niece Angelica (16) with their mom from Nashville from the Shreveport bus station. Kevin and Angelica were to spend the summer with their dad, my brother, Terry Moses Sr. My daughter, Jade, had begged and begged me to stay all night. I kept saying, "No, let them enjoy their parents and each other, and we will pick them up tomorrow."

Exactly six hours after dropping them off at my brother's house, which was 12:00 AM on 06/12/2006 after their return from Subway on from Hwy 6 from taking their mom to the bus station, where she was going back home to Tennessee where my 14-year-old nephew David, was left with her friends because he had another two weeks of football camp before he could come. My brother Terry Sr., Kevin, and Angelica's lives were tragically lost in a house fire. But they were all saved, because they had already received Christ in their lives and were already water baptized. Smoke inhalation had taken them out before their bodies began to burn. Today, my daughter is very grateful that I told her "No"! And David, who is now 33, confessed Christ in my vehicle on 06/16/2006, after I talked to him about how that could've been him too. He accepted Christ into his life as his personal Savior and was baptized the morning after the funerals on 06/18/2006. Jade accepted Christ and was baptized on 01/26/2007.

Let us not forget about the passage in Job 1:8 when Jesus spoke to Satan, saying:" Have you considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, that feared God, and avoid evil?

During these near-death experiences, like with Job, think back over your life on the numerous times that Jesus has spoken on your behalf to Satan, like with his servant Job, saying:" Very well, he is in thy hands, and you can go ahead and do what you want, but spare his life". Job 2:6. Amen. Be blessed and Happy Holidays.
